## Affidavit of Aish Ayyash

My name is Aish Ayyash. I was detainee in the Cook County Jail for 163 days until I was released on March 26, 2020.

- 1. Until recently, I resided in Division 9, Tier 1B of the Cook County Jail. There were around 40 to 45 people incarcerated on my tier.
- 2. I shared a cell with another individual. I slept on the bottom bunk. Our beds were less than 3 feet apart. It was impossible to maintain a 6-foot distance between us because our cell was not big enough to allow it. We shared a toilet in the cell.
- 3. There were 3 toilets in the dayroom shared by the 40 to 45 people housed in the tier. The toilets were regularly broken. When I left, everyone was sharing 1 working communal toilet.
- 4. There was only 1 functioning sink.
- 5. There was 1 shower area shared by everyone. It had 6 shower heads. When I left, only 4 showerheads were working. The other 2 were broken.
- 6. There were 6 tables in the dining hall, where 8 people sat close together at each table. It was impossible to socially distance ourselves while eating.
- 7. I was not given soap.
- 8. I had to purchase soap at commissary with my own funds. It was crushed by the officers before purchase.
- 9. Officers were wearing gloves, but very few had masks. One officer told me that he only had a mask because he bought it himself.
- 10. I was never provided masks, gloves, or any personal protective equipment at any point.
- 11. While I was there, one person tested positive for COVID-19. He appeared sick for multiple days before he saw a doctor. After he tested positive, he was taken from the division, his belongings were placed in a garbage bag, and the officers quickly wiped down his cell. Staff did not clean any of the common areas. His roommate was also removed from the tier, but I did not see or hear about anyone else getting tested after he left.
